(**Time 9:04**) City Finance Chair Kenneth Boudreaux called the budget briefing to order. He then asked Ken Stansbury to offer the invocation and Thomas Hooks to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chair Boudreaux welcomed everyone to this budget briefing on the proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 budget. Citizens were instructed that a speaker form should be filled out in order to address the Council and be submitted to Council Clerk Veronica L. Arceneaux. He stated that the proposed budget document has been posted to the LCG website on the Finance page and that public comment would be held immediately following each department's budget review. Chair Boudreaux identified the three (3) possible actions that could be taken during the briefings. A Council member may propose changing the budget by: (1) a general amendment, when the entire Council agrees on a recommendation/proposed amendment; (2) a separate amendment, when a Council member objects to a recommended budget change; or (3) a Council member may choose to mark an item for wrap-up discussion to allow time to receive additional information.

Chair Boudreaux provided further guidance on the budget process, especially for the benefit of new Councilmembers. He recognized Mayor-President Monique Boulet and CAO Rachel Godeaux, who offered brief opening remarks on behalf of the administration, particularly noting investments within this proposed budget for infrastructure and public safety. Mayor-President Boulet expressed her appreciation to Councilmembers for their partnership through the budget process.

### **BUDGET PRESENTATION - FINANCE:**

CFO Karen Fontenot introduced Finance & Management Department staff in attendance and offered the FY 2024-2025 Proposed Operating & Five-Year Capital Improvement Budget presentation, which highlighted American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA), group insurance premiums (no change), and uninsured losses, splitting of Sales Tax Capital Improvement Fund (Fund 401), and the implementation of a pay plan for classified employees. She

also provided overviews of the Parish-wide Revenues & Expenditures, the City-wide Revenues & Expenditures, and the LCG Entity-wide Revenues & Expenditures.

Hooks asked that Finance be prepared to provide guidance on what's driving the need for fund reserves throughout the budget and he asked for an ongoing understanding of the MERS liability taking into account the pay plan. He also asked that Finance consider and offer information throughout the budget process on the impact of the pay plan on the various funds, an inquiry to which Finance staff responded by providing a handout with information outlining related details.

Page 258 – AB Rubin questioned RESERVE-DIRECTOR'S line items, to which CFO Fontenot responded that these are reserve line items budgeted for each department director for incidental capital or unforeseen emergencies within the department.

John Guilbeau expressed concern about the origin of funding for demolitions that are contracted as a result of condemnations, particularly regarding if/how LCG gets reimbursed.
