VIII. Old Business

1. Lafayette Preservation Plan 2024 Timeline – Roxana Usner reported on the proposed timeline for creating a preservation plan. Commission members provided comments. Discussion determined that the plan should:

- Demonstrate how historic districts have resulted in in property value increases and connect to Lafayette's economic development and real estate values.
- b. Showcase Lafayette's historic and cultural stock.
- c. Connect with movements that are already existing, such as the significance of Mid-City neighborhood.
- d. Look at what will become historic and work with LCG to define districts with street improvements.
- e. Define our values. State what the future will hold for the cultural and historic areas.
- f. Incorporate assistance to historic property owners such as banks who have provided loans for historic rehabilitation projects and historic trades exhibitions and workshops.
- 2. Preservation Plan Professional Services Companies Roxana Usner shared research on the top industry consultants who have written proven preservation plans. Commission member Kelly Russo suggested that prior to writing a Preservation Plan, LHPC first needs help from a public relations firm who can assist with educating the public and helping Lafayette citizens and administrators understand and delineate what is worthy to preserve.
