CARPENTER II

PURPOSE AND NATURE OF WORK

Positions so classified lead and direct a crew of journeyman carpenters in the construction, maintenance and repair of structural, as well as other woodwork in accordance with standard practices of the trade. Assignments may be oral or written and may be accompanied by sketches or blueprints. The work is performed independently and is reviewed by a supervisor for progress and results. This class is distinguished from Carpenter I by the level of skill required. May serve as a crew foreman, depending on area of assignment.

<u>ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK</u> (Note: These examples are intended only to illustrate the various types of work performed by incumbents in this class. All of the duties performed by any one incumbent may not be listed, nor does any incumbent necessarily perform all of these duties.)

May lead, direct, participate in, and ensure satisfactory workmanship in the following: Proper removal of foundation sills, joists and subflooring. Installation of wood, concrete, and vinyl siding, soffit, fascia. Wood framing of floors, walls, ceiling, and roofs. Installation of plywood roof decks, ceilings, walls, and floors. Installation of finished ceiling material such as ceiling tile, sheetrock, etc. Proper removal of interior and exterior doors and frames. Installation of interior and exterior doors in existing frames and installation of complete door and frame units. Installation of crown molding, baseboard, shoebase, window and door trim, and other moldings and trim. Removal and installation of windows and window frames. Installation of storm doors. Construction and installation of kitchen and bath cabinets, glue-down laminate countertops and post-form countertops. Construction and installation of wood and aluminum component ramps for handicap accessibility. Builds various pieces of office furniture, including but not limited to desks, credenzas, bookshelves, and cabinets.

Performs related work as required.

NECESSARY KNOWLEDGES, ABILITIES, AND SKILLS

Considerable knowledge of the standard practices, methods, tools, and materials of the trade.

Ability to organize and effectively supervise the work of Carpenter I's, depending on area of assignment.

Ability to plan, lay-out, and perform carpentry work related to assignment.

Knowledge of the hazards and safety precautions of the trade.

Skill in the use of tools, materials and equipment used in the carpentry trade.

Knowledge of the qualities and uses of various woods and the ability to inspect lumber for quality and grade.

Ability to understand and effectively carry out oral and written instructions and to work from sketches and blueprints.

Ability to establish and maintain effective relationships with superiors and other employees.

DESIRABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

Graduation from a standard high school or equivalent, and extensive experience as a carpenter in the general repair or maintenance of buildings, completion of a carpentry apprenticeship, or any equivalent combination of training and experience.
