

Used to survey for immature mosquitoes and identify stage of life cycle



Truck Treatments

- Tracking of location and speed
- Track on/off chemicals
- Automatic shutoff of areas with bees and sensitivities
- Rate of chemical spray is based on speed of truck
- Drivers can see parameters of spray assignments and service requests

Virus Response:

- Louisiana Animal Disease and Diagnostic Laboratory or Louisiana Department of Health Notification
- Notify Bess Foret Lafayette Parish Government
- Hand out pamphlets to educate/notify public (Unless Human – HIPPA)
- Truck spray three consecutive nights
- Treat all water for immature mosquitoes
- Set out follow-up surveillance traps population and to test for WNV
- Keep pressure and surveillance on area
